WOOD KNAPP, Elizabeth "Betsy"

With Generosity, Vision, Alumna Transformed Wellesley College

Wellesley College mourns the passing of Elizabeth "Betsy" Wood Knapp, class of 1964. She died at her home in Edwards, Colo., on June 20 at the age of 74, according to her husband, Cleon "Bud" Knapp. Betsy was a beloved member of the Wellesley community, widely admired and respected as a distinguished leader in her field and as a highly influential alumna whose decades of support had a profound effect on generations of students.

Betsy served on the Wellesley College Board of Trustees for 15 years, was a founding member of the Wellesley College Business Leadership Council, and co-chaired the College's record-setting \$400 million comprehensive campaign that ended in 2005. Most importantly, Betsy was a friend and counselor to three Wellesley presidents—and to countless others in the Wellesley community.

A pioneer in online interactive computer software, an angel investor, and a passionate philanthropist, Betsy exemplified Wellesley's motto, "Not to be ministered unto, but to minister."

"Betsy contributed to Wellesley in immeasurable ways, marrying her enormous generosity with a perspective that was keenly forward-looking," said Wellesley College President Paula Johnson. "She was truly cherished, inspiring deep and lasting affection from everyone whose path she crossed. Her loss is a loss we deeply feel as a

community." "I worked with Betsy for 20 years, and never encountered a more creative, daring, or loyal trustee," said Wellesley College Provost Andrew Shennan. "Surely the true mark of loyalty to one's college is the desire to make it into something better, not simply to secure what it once was. Betsy's generous support for innovation in teaching and learning and for integrating technology in the classroom has made Wellesley a more inventive, more generative, and more interesting institution. We will always be grateful to Betsy for seeing that potential and helping us realize it."

Betsy's support of Wellesley was rooted in her desire to have a creative and transformative impact on the lives of students and to enable the College to address the challenges of ever-changing technologies. Her generosity made possible the creation of the Knapp Media and Technology Center, a hub for state-of-the-art technology, and the Knapp Social Science Center, which integrated the social sciences, providing spaces for interdisciplinary programming, instruction, and research and connecting the intellectual work of social science to its role in the real world. She also endowed funds to support ongoing technology and education innovation at Wellesley and to provide financial aid to students with an interest in entrepreneurship.

"One important aspect of Betsy's leadership was her unwavering commitment to Wellesley's campus buildings and landscape," said Cameron



Mason, Wellesley College vice president of resources and public affairs. "As a trustee of the College, and in her own life with her work at Architectural Digest and the Knapp Ranch, where she called home and pursued new sustainable farming practices, Betsy demonstrated her commitment to the built environment and the experience of space."

"Everyone who knew Betsy was touched by her warmth and her generosity of spirit. Over the course of my tenure as president, I took much strength and delight from Betsy's friendship, and I benefited greatly from her wisdom," said H. Kim Bottomly, Wellesley's 13th president. "She will always hold a special place in my heart."

Betsy Wood Knapp's name, her legacy, and her vision for how technology can change the world will feature prominently in the history—and future—of Wellesley. She will forever be missed by her many friends and fellow alumnae, and by all those at the College who knew and loved her.
